Garner Teen Wins Oratory Contest

DES MOINES – A Garner teen was given a standing ovation by a sold-out crowd at Iowa Right to Life's Spring Fling dinner Saturday, May 3, at the Forte Convention Center in Des Moines for his speech that took first prize in Iowa Right to Life's 2008 Oratory Contest.

Micah Howe, 18, received \$200 for his first place oratory, *Abortion: The Slippery Slope*, in the competition, which took place earlier Saturday in Des Moines. The senior from Garner-Hayfield High School said the fact that he is adopted is the inspiration for his pro-life position. In addition, Howe earned a trip to Washington D.C. to represent Iowa in National Right to Life's Oratory Contest on July 5.

"This is the first year we have had this contest and it exceeded all expectations," said Kim Lehman, President of Iowa Right to Life. "These contestants are the future of the pro-life movement and they were all incredibly passionate, inspirational and very well spoken."

Trinh Le, a senior at North High School in Des Moines was the runner-up in the contest, winning \$100; and **Lizzie Carey**, a home-schooler from West Des Moines, won third prize, \$50.

Contestants in the Iowa Right to Life Oratory Contest were to research, write and present an original, 5-7 minute, pro-life speech on abortion, infanticide, euthanasia or stem cell research. Contestants were judged

on four criteria: Introduction, Content, Presentation and Conclusion. Iowa Right to Life plans to make the Oratory Contest an annual event.

Howe, the winner, will attend Moody Bible Institute in Chicago this fall. He is currently a volunteer ministry assistant at Garner Evangelical Free Church and enjoys golf and preaching at churches and youth groups.

Legislative Session Ends with \$200,000 for Pro-Life Pregnancy Centers in Iowa

DES MOINES – Planned Parenthood of Greater Iowa worked hard to secure more tax dollars from Iowans for their so-called “Healthy Families” campaign, but fell just short of the \$1,000,000 they were looking for.

Planned Parenthood lobbied for the money by sounding the alarm over teen pregnancy, in a major campaign that included TV, radio and multiple mailings. As it turns out, **Iowa Right to Life exposed the fact that Iowa already has one of the lowest teen pregnancy rates in the country, and already distributes over 19 million dollars**

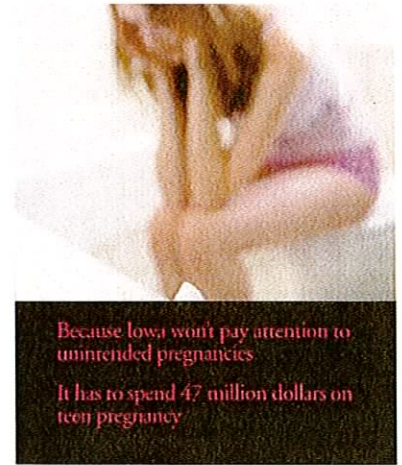
Planned Parenthood was trying to get money for a problem that doesn't exist!

Iowa Right to Life, with a number of

gutsy pro-life officials, were able to limit Planned Parenthood's new income to \$750,000, while \$200,000 was redirected to maternity homes, pregnancy centers and adoption agencies to help women and teens in crisis pregnancies. Thanks to Senator David Johnson of Sioux County and Representative Matt Whindschittl of Pottawattamie, who proposed the amendments that led to the money going to organizations that promote life.

The fight is not over. Planned Parenthood has future plans to increase the funds to help them expand all over Iowa.

We have an uphill battle, because the Iowa House, Senate and Executive Branch are all controlled by the Democrats, who with a few exceptions, tow the pro-abortion line.
