



## Planned Parenthood of the Heartland's Medical Director Dismembered Babies Without Lethal Injection

**Dr. Jill Meadows' grisly work is documented in Supreme Court Carhart case**

**WARNING: this article has violent, disturbing descriptions**

DES MOINES—With last year's announcement that late-term abortionist LeRoy Carhart was planning to set up shop in Council Bluffs, there was a lot of focus on Carhart's ugly business.

Little did Iowans know, Planned Parenthood of the Heartland's new Medical Director, Dr. Jill Meadows, hired in July 2010, makes Carhart look like an angel.

Meadows' grisly work as a late-term abortionist—actually twisting and tearing apart live babies in the womb and crushing their skulls—is documented in the Supreme Court Case, *Carhart vs. Gonzales (2007)*, in which Meadows, along with LeRoy Carhart, was a plaintiff.

Meadows, then known as Dr. Jill Vibhakar, argued unsuccessfully against the Partial Birth Abortion Ban Act (2003), which outlawed the procedure where a baby is pulled partway through the birth canal, then torn limb from limb.

One would think testifying before the Supreme Court is an impressive credential on a resume, that Planned Parenthood might want to boast.

Not this testimony.

According to the summary of the *Carhart* case, Dr. Vibhakar (Meadows) testified that "100%



*of her second trimester D & E procedures involve fetal dismemberment."* (Tr. 362, Test. Dr. Vibhakar)

### Babies Dismembered Alive

Additional revelations show her hard-hearted, complete indifference to the unborn child's suffering. Meadows did not care that babies were alive during abortions she performed: "*Before Dr. Vibhakar (Meadows) begins a second-trimester D & E, the fetus is likely alive, as documented by an ultrasound per-*

*formed either a day or a few weeks before the procedure. Dr. Vibhakar does not know when fetal demise occurs during her procedures, nor is there any clinical significance to when demise occurs in her opinion."*

## ***Saving Brother Michael: Minnesota Brothers Defend Rights of the Disabled and Vulnerable***

Brother Paul O'Donnell never expected to find Brother Michael Gaworski lying in bed not breathing and without a pulse. He frantically began CPR and dialed 911.

Little did Brother Paul know, on that sunny day back in March 1991, that the fight to save his best friend was just beginning.

Speaking at the National Right to Life Convention in Jacksonville, FL this past June, Brother Paul used the story of Brother Michael as a launching point. In his talk, *Defending the Rights of the Disabled and the Vulnerable*. It was a great call to action for anyone who has relatives or friends who are elderly, disabled or ill.

Brother Paul is from the Franciscan Brothers of Peace, a religious order, based in St. Paul, MN, dedicated to defending life. Brother Paul is also President of the Board of the Terri Schiavo Life and Hope Network.

Active in the pro-life movement since he was a teen, Brother Paul said he knew about euthanasia and what was happening in Holland and the Netherlands. He knew about The Hemlock Society. "But I had no idea how bad it was in our health care system," he said.

Within 2-3 minutes of arriving at the hospital, Brother Paul was ushered into a trauma room where a registered nurse counseled him, "If your friend lives, he will probably be a vegetable for the rest of his life and you would not want that for your friend."

"Being the strong pro-life person I was," said Brother Paul, "I said, 'Thank you

very much for your services. I don't wish to talk to you anymore.'"

The next person who came to see him was the hospital chaplain, who said, "Things don't look very

### **Fight for Your Right to Treatment: Brother Paul's Call to Action**

Here are things Brother Paul says we need to know to advocate for loved ones who are elderly, disabled or ill:

#### **1) Have a Medical Advocate**

Gone are the days when the family doctor looks after your interests. You need people who are willing to fight for you. Advance directives are often disregarded by hospital ethics committees and futile care committees. Your Medical Advocate may be a spouse or it may be a trusted friend. You might want to have two people.

#### **2) Understand The Language**

The language of health care is not based on Judeo-Christian principles. The term "quality of life" is a secular term that means nothing. Do not buy into talk about feeling like a burden. Where there is love, there is no burden.

#### **3) Be Willing to Fight**

When you are sick in the hospital you are very vulnerable and medical personnel can be very suggestive. You can take 24 hours to think about any decisions. You have the right to a second opinion. You must be willing to fight the insurance companies if needed. Insurance companies will reject a lot and 90 percent of the people just accept it, but the people that appeal and fight, win. If you don't have the resources, the Terri Schiavo Life and Hope Network can help you find them.

#### **4) Do Not Confuse End of Life Issues with Active Imposed Death**

Terri Schiavo probably could have lived another 20 years. It was an imposed death because she was disabled. Euthanasia is killing someone deliberately. If you are dying with cancer, you don't have to take chemotherapy.

#### **5) Food and Hydration are Ordinary Care**

Food and hydration are basic needs, even if you need assistance to receive it. If death is imminent and the patient can no longer assimilate it — that is different than to stop food and water to a patient for three weeks and having that be the cause of death.

#### **6) Be Careful of DNR/DNI Orders**

(Do Not Resuscitate/ Do Not Intubate) It's okay if you are dying to refuse treatment. But, do not make a blanket statement with a Will to Live. Brother Paul said his own mother changed her mind and asked to be put on a ventilator after saying previously she did not want to be on one. How you feel at 30 may be different than how you feel at 40 or how you feel at 81.

## Terri's Family Fights and Wins Foundation fights for disabled who are denied care

JACKSONVILLE, FL—Six years after Terri Schindler-Schiavo was systematically dehydrated and starved to death, her family is winning battles to prevent discrimination against people with cognitive disabilities.

Terri's sister, Suzanne Vitadamo, Director of Development for the Terri Schiavo Life and Hope Network, speaking at the National Right to Life Convention in Jacksonville Florida in June talked about several of the over 200 cases the foundation has been involved in to date.

### **Baby Joseph Maraachli**

The parents of Baby Joseph just wanted a simple treatment for their son, so he could go home and not have to die in the hospital. In the case earlier this year which made

international headlines, the Canadian hospital denied him care and the Canadian courts ruled against the family. Terri's Foundation became involved, along with Brother Paul (see article on previous page) and the Priests for Life led by Fr. Frank Pavone. Baby Joseph was transferred to a hospital in St. Louis, MO, and in April, his parents were able to take him home to Windsor, Canada, where he is breathing on his own.

### **Jesse Ramirez**

Jesse fell out of a moving car during an argument with his wife in 2007. Days later, Jesse's estranged wife wanted to withdraw his feeding tube and hydration. Jesse was without food and water for five days when his parents won in court the

right to continue his nutrition and hydration. Jesse regained consciousness within two weeks and later walked out of the hospital.

Terri's brother Bobby Schindler cautioned that denial of care to those with cognitive disabilities is all too common. "Basic food and water are removed from people every day," he said, "Something that would have been thought barbaric 10-20 years ago is now considered ordinary."

He also spoke of an exciting new venture to care for the cognitively disabled.

### **New Beginnings Rehab Facility**

In April 2011 in Medford, NY, The New Beginnings Community Center for Brain Injury Rehabilitation opened to care for people who are not dying, but require sustained care—people who might be rejected from hospitals as "futile care." New Beginnings was founded by Allyson Scerri, a hair-dresser who had cared for her father, who had suffered a brain injury in a motorcycle accident.

Schindler, who attended the Grand Opening, said he hopes to see more rehab centers like this open and said it could be vital to returning veterans with traumatic brain injuries.

good, Brother, and I would like to know if you would consider donating Brother Michael's organs to help someone else. That would be the greatest gift of life that your community could give." Brother Paul responded, "Absolutely not."

Brother Michael was diagnosed as having a sudden bacterial pneumonia, similar to the one that ended the life of Muppets creator, Jim Henson. It left Brother Michael a quadriplegic and in a severely brain injured state.

To continue Brother Michael's care, Brother Paul had to fight to keep him in a hospital that did not want to treat him, fight pressures to stop treatment, fight for physical therapy for Brother Michael and even a change in attending physicians. After eight months of hospitalization, the Franciscan Brothers were able to bring Brother Michael home, where they cared for him for another 12 years.

Brother Paul is thankful. "I am grateful for the time we had and the lives he touched." He also hopes it will inspire others to advocate for our most vulnerable brothers and sisters.

## Did You Know? Iowa's Futile Care Law

Under current Iowa law, a physician can order life-sustaining medical treatment withheld from a patient, against the wishes of the patient's family, guardian, surrogate or written advance directives from the patient. In other words, the doctor's word supersedes even the instructions in a living will created by an attorney. (Section 144A.9 of Iowa's Life-Sustaining Procedures Act)

## Fox News Contributor Fred Barnes calls Life Movement “Robust, Growing, Vibrant”

JACSONVILLE, FL—Whether you know him from *Fox News* or recall John McLaughlin calling, “*Freddie Barnes*” on the McLaughlin Group, few can fire up a crowd like Fred Barnes.

Now Executive Editor of *The Weekly Standard*, Barnes ignited the crowd at the National Right to Life Convention in Jacksonville, FL, in June, calling the pro-life movement “robust, growing and vibrant.” Barnes dismissed political analysts who have said pro-life issues have been holding back the Republican Party, saying, “Opposing abortion continues to expand the Republican Party and strengthen it.”

Barnes praised new pro-life entrepreneurial movements such as the **40 Days for Life** prayer vigil and **Lila Rose’s** undercover investigations of Planned Parenthood. He marveled at Rose’s “courage and moxie” as a teen, to enter PP with a hidden camera, posing as a prostitute or a minor seeking an abortion. He added that pro-abortion or left wing websites are “fit to be tied” over Lila Rose.

As well they should be. Barnes talked about how Rose’s undercover videos resulted in recent legislation to defund PP that passed the U.S. House.

“There are twice as many crisis pregnancy centers as there are abortion mills,” said Barnes. He also cited the overwhelming number of young people at the March for Life in Washington D.C. every year and that Students for Life has grown from under 300 to over 600 college student groups in five years.

Not so for the pro-abortion ranks. “When I compare the energy and the commitment of the pro-life movement to the abortion lobby, that’s out of gas and reduced to trying to change the subject away from abortion,” said Barnes, “It’s pretty clear the tide has changed.

And when the tide has changed, it can’t be stopped.”

### **Incremental legislation: Wise to Get What We Can**

Addressing a hot topic in this past Iowa legislative session, Barnes praised the pro-lifers’ pursuit of incremental legislation.


“The pro-life movement has been politically wise in pursuing a strategy of getting everything you can that is possible under the circumstances,” said Barnes. “Don’t spend all your time trying to achieve things that are not achievable under the current political and social circumstances, because there is so much that can be achieved just under these circumstances.”

“The truth is the incremental strategy in so many states is saving the lives of unborn children,” Barnes said. “And once so many of these new regulations and limits on abortion are implemented in state after state, more and more lives of the unborn will be saved.”

Barnes quoted a study by Michael New, Political Science Professor at the University of Alabama which showed how incremental pro-life laws led to tangible reductions in abortions:

- Opting out of Medicaid funded abortions, **reduces abortions by 9 percent**
- Informed consent laws (allow a woman to view her ultrasound, more info about options) **reduces abortions 5-7 percent**
- Parental involvement **reduces abortions in minors by 15 percent**

“These are good numbers,” said Barnes. He also praised the issue of “fetal pain”, which he said is important because like partial birth abortion, it focuses on the baby. “Who can tolerate—at least publicly—a baby in the womb that’s feeling pain?” asked Barnes, adding, “It’s hard to attack.”

Barnes predicted there will be many more victories to come in the short run — this year, next year. “Much sooner than I thought,” said Barnes, “The stain that abortion has left on America will be washed away entirely.”

### **IRTL Supports Incremental Pro-Life Legislation**

Pro-lifers are sometimes divided into two well-intentioned factions:

- 1) **Incremental strategists** believe in passing what we can until the day when we can eliminate all abortions.
- 2) **All-or-nothing strategists** believe in passing only legislation that ban all abortions or pass nothing at all.

Iowa Right to Life believes in the first strategy. In the Iowa Legislature’s 2011 session, IRTL supported the Late-term Abortion Ban, that would have kept abortionist LeRoy Carhart from opening in Council Bluffs. Such legislation can save lives and also change hearts, because it educates the public about the atrocities of abortion. We hope you will join us in supporting this bill when it comes up again in the 2012 session.

a windfall of legislation to defund PP and energized pro-lifers across the country.

Rose inspired the crowd at Iowa Right to Life's Spring Fling dinner April 28, showing clips from her undercover videos and talking about her harrowing experiences.

At a PP in Bloomington, IN, Rose was posing as a 13 year-old, pregnant by a 31 year-old boyfriend. Instead of reporting the crime as statutory rape, the PP counselor advised Rose to look into other states that don't have parental notification laws to get an abortion.

Rose proved that the lies at PP come from the top. PP's CEO Cecile Richards appeared on cable TV on the Joy Behar Show and said if PP were defunded, millions of women would not get mammograms. Rose said not one PP location is equipped with a mammogram machine.

"We are missing cousins, co-workers—one-third of my generation," said Rose.

Rose also urged everyone to be faithful. "It is not our fight, it is the fight of our Lord Jesus Christ," she said. "We are here to assist Him."

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## Christie Vilsack Covers Her Roots

### *What she's not saying on the campaign trail...*

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running for Congress, there's no mention of Planned Parenthood or Healthy Families on her website, <http://christievilsackforiowa.com>.

Not even a peep about Planned Parenthood at her campaign launch July 19, 2011, in Ames. But in her brief launch speech Vilsack did mention Jake, her grandchild she was carrying around like a campaign prop—*twice*. And mentioned there's "another one on the way."

### Why Christie, Why?

Even her friends have noticed. One liberal blog opined back in April that **Vilsack was chosen as one of four promising candidates by abortion activist group, "Emily's List"**: "So far I haven't seen any mention of the 'Emily's List' announcement on the Christie Vilsack for Iowa website, Facebook page or Twitter account."

- Christie Vilsack donated money to Planned Parenthood in 2009. Now they donate to her. PP and Emily's List have both donated to Christie's campaign, according to *The Iowa Republican*.
- Nancy Pelosi gave Christie \$4,000 (Now we know where

that grandchild-as-a-campaign-prop comes from.)

- Christie was the guest of honor at open houses for new PPs in Fort Dodge and Creston in 2008.
- Christie was keynote speaker at a PP fundraiser in Burlington in 2008 and visited the Mount Pleasant PP in the same trip.
- Representatives of PP of the Heartland were recognized at Christie's fundraiser at Prairie Moon Winery in Ames July 1, the *Ames Tribune* reported. A PP donor was master of ceremonies.

### Christie's Initiative: *The Buffet Way*

Christie's campaign website does mention she was Executive Director of the **Iowa Initiative**, but refers to it as: "a privately funded research program focused on women's health."

*Women's health? Really?*

The Iowa Initiative is bankrolled by Warren Buffet. While many know of Buffet's financial success, not everyone knows he is one of the biggest donors in the world to population control and abortion organizations like Planned Parenthood, National Abortion Rights Action League (NARAL) and the Population Council which promotes abortion worldwide.

Buffet was even instrumental in bringing the abortion pill RU-486 to the U.S.

Iowa Right to Life wants to make sure Christie's accomplishments at the Iowa Initiative are not forgotten.

- The Iowa Initiative gave Planned Parenthood money to implant 7,000 IUDs (interuterine devices—birth control) in Iowa women, reported *ABC News*.
- Iowa Initiative's *Avoid the Stork* "to reduce unintended pregnancies" campaign, which is supposed to target ages 18-30 is an underhanded way to sexualize children by using a costumed

stork mascot (think "Joe Camel") that shows up in print ads, billboard and TV commercials. The stork mascot also makes public appearances at the Iowa Speedway and various festivals.

- Children who log on to the Stork website are treated to cartoon images, like praying hands for the "Pull N' Pray" method, which the site says "is also known as withdrawal, when the male anatomy is quickly removed from the woman's before the act of ejaculation."



- *Avoid the Stork* mirrors a failed federally-funded campaign from the 1970s, "Stop the Stork", which cost taxpayers hundreds of thousands of dollars.

### Still Involved in Iowa Initiative

We know that Christie is so humble about her accomplishments at the Iowa Initiative, that she has been holding back that **she is still on the Board of Directors there**.

As under her leadership, Iowa Initiative is stacked with PP's biggest supporters: Susan Knapp, whose real estate husband Bill used his fortune to open a PP abortion location near Drake U in her name; former State Sen. Maggie Tinsman, Dr. Andrea McGuire, who throws fundraisers for PP at her home. Former Lt. Gov. Sally Pederson is the new Executive Director.

Christie Vilsack may be mum on her ties to big abortion in Iowa, but Iowa Right to Life will not be.

## Planned Parenthood of the Heartland's Medical Director is worse than Carhart

### Inducing Fetal Demise

How is Dr. Meadows worse than Dr. Carhart? Witnesses in the Carhart case testified that an abortionist could "induce fetal demise before an abortion procedure to avoid performing an intact D & E on a living fetus."

At 18 weeks, according to testimony, Dr. Carhart anesthetizes the unborn baby with lidocaine and gives the baby a lethal injection of digoxin before dismembering it. (Tr. 607-08, 629-31, 632, 637, 671, Test. Dr. Carhart.)

Dr. Meadows does not.

*"Dr. Vibhakar (Meadows) does not induce fetal demise prior to performing abortions with intrauterine or intrafetal injections of digoxin or KCl because "[i]t's not deemed necessary and it would add an increased burden to the girl/woman with an additional procedure and small risk associated with that, and more anxiety and discomfort and expense and time involved."* (Tr. 347-49, Test. Dr. Vibhakar.)

### University of Iowa's Kill Policy to Avoid Live Birth

The Carhart case is a revealing look inside University of Iowa's Hospital and Clinics, where Meadows was practitioner and instructor for 11 years: *"However, it is the policy of the University of Iowa where Dr. Vibhakar is employed to induce fetal demise after 22 weeks prior to performing induction abortions to avoid delivery of a live fetus."*

And then in a chilling reminder of what can happen when the baby survives the abortion, killing the baby first: *"...avoids confusion on the part of the staff in regard to resuscitation issues."* (Tr. 393-94, Test. Dr. Vibhakar.)

The testimony also said the U of I *"discourages elective abortions at its facility, but will allow patients who do not fit within the admission*

*criteria at the Emma Goldman Clinic or Planned Parenthood to obtain an abortion there."* (Tr. 400-09, Test. Dr. Vibhakar.)

### 264 2nd Trimester Abortions at Emma Goldman Clinic

Dr. Vibhakar's (Meadows) testimony shows she performed

*"1 to 3 abortions per month at the University of Iowa Hospitals and 264 second-trimester abortions at the Emma Goldman Clinic between 2001 and 2003."*

(Note: Emma Goldman clinic advertises abortions up to 20 weeks.)

Keep in mind Dr. Meadows worked in Iowa City **for 11 years**. Imagine how many babies have died agonizing deaths at her hands. And that may not be the only place where she aborted babies. She has also been listed with PP of Bettendorf.

### "Removal of Fetus"

The Carhart case exposes the barbaric practices of PP of the Heartland's Medical Director: *"To facilitate removing large pieces of the fetus, Dr. Vibhakar (Meadows) grasps fetal parts that start coming through the cervix, and then regrasps or twists those parts at a higher level in the cervix or uterus, rather than continuing to pull on the part such that it disarticulates. When a part of the fetus is too large to fit through the cervix, it separates from the rest of the fetus's body, causing "multiple passes" to be made to remove the entire fetus."* (Tr. 338-41, Test. Dr. Vib-

hakar.)

### "Compression of Fetal Skull"

*"Dr. Vibhakar has had two cases at 18 or 19 and 21 weeks where the fetus has delivered intact up to the head, after which she disarticulated the body from the head, used forceps to compress the fetal head, and extracted the head."* (Tr. 341-42 and 381-83, Test. Dr. Vibhakar.)

*"Whether the fetus delivers intact up to the fetal head, or whether Dr. Vibhakar has disarticulated the fetus in some fashion in the course of removing the fetus, she must compress the head in some fashion in order to fit through the cervix. Such compression can create skull fragments that can cause lacerations."* (Tr. 383-84 and 399, Test. Dr. Vibhakar)

A telling quote from Meadows follows that text, *"Can't think of a time when it's come out without being compressed."*

### Are Late Term Abortions in Iowa in Planned Parenthood's Plans?

PP's hiring of Dr. Jill Meadows raises interesting questions:

- 1) Is Planned Parenthood planning to do late-term abortions in Iowa?** PP does abortions over 20 weeks in Overland Park, KS; St. Louis, MO; Ann Arbor, MI; Billings, MT and many more locations. At an average of \$1,500, late-term abortions profits.
- 2) Is PP planning late-term abortions for their new abortion profit-center in Lincoln, NE?**
- 3) Is PP already doing late-term abortions in Iowa?**

We encourage you to read through the Carhart v. Gonzales documents, challenge pro-abortion candidates with the text, "Is this what you meant by a woman's 'right to choose'?"

There is no reason that babies in Iowa should be tortured at the hands of people like Planned Parenthood's Dr. Jill Meadows.

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## PP Offering Webcam Abortions for Rural Women in the Drake University Neighborhood

DES MOINES—Planned Parenthood repeatedly claims it has webcam abortions to help rural women. So why are PPs in Des Moines, where abortionists are plentiful, outfitted with webcam abortion equipment?

KCCI-TV's (CBS affiliate) story on PP of the Heartland's webcam abortions may have unintentionally revealed something new. PP's Susan Knapp location near Drake University is set-up for webcam abortions.

The KCCI piece, which ran in May 2010, showed PP abortionist Dr. Tom Ross demonstrating the webcam abortions with PP personnel at a "remote" location. KCCI's reporter said, "Dr. Tom Ross greets his patient, who may be 100 miles away on a computer monitor."

100 miles...or maybe just across town.



Planned Parenthood says webcam abortions are to help women in rural Iowa. So why are the PPs near Drake U, Ankeny High School and in Urbandale equipped with webcams?

Dr. Ross clicks an option on his computer screen that says, "Susan Knapp Pill Dispensing Unit." The Susan Knapp PP is located near Drake University in Des Moines. The employee on the receiving end in the video is someone we know works at

the Susan Knapp location.

It makes sense that KCCI would want a location close by for the demo. What doesn't make sense is why PP would equip Des Moines locations with abortion pill dispensing units in the first place.

KCCI missed the chance to ask the obvious: *Why do you need webcam abortions in Des Moines?*

Because PP is "big abortion." In no way are PP's webcam abortions about helping rural women. PP has outfitted even the Des Moines, Ankeny and Urbandale locations—most likely at no small cost—because abortion by pills mean big profits for PP.
